Regional average earnings per job are \$26.6K below the national average earnings of \$85.0K per job.


Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population **declined by 1.2**% since 2019, falling by 5,003. Population is expected to **decrease by 1.8**% between 2024 and 2029, losing 7,710.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs increased by 3.4% in Kentucky Power-Served Counties from 139,689 to 144,452. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.9% by 0.5%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 42.1% to 43.0% between 2019 and 2024.
- Concerning educational attainment, **8.7% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (12.8% below the national average), and **9.2% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.3% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), General Medical and Surgical Hospitals, and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends













Inbound and Outbound Migration

The table below analyzes past and current residents of Kentucky Power-Served Counties. The left column shows residents of other counties migrating to Kentucky Power-Served Counties. The right column shows residents migrating from Kentucky Power-Served Counties to other counties.

As of 2022, 375 people have migrated from Lawrence County, OH to Kentucky Power-Served Counties. In the same year, 503 people left Kentucky Power-Served Counties migrating to Fayette County, KY. The total Net Migration for Kentucky Power-Served Counties in 2022 was -552.








Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP








Educational Pipeline

In 2023, there were 7,575 graduates in Kentucky Power-Served Counties. This pipeline has grown by 2% over the last 5 years.
